

Salahadin Tribe of Iraq ratifies the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations

WHEREAS we, the representatives of the Salahadin tribe of Iraq, declare:

- A. The Salahadin tribe and other national and regional inter-tribal nations wish to create a greater voice for individual tribes through implementing the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations.
- B. The International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations acknowledges that inter-tribal alliances may replace, supersede, or act as substitute for individual member tribal policies and governmental actions, and tribal leaders have dedicated their cooperative effort for years to craft a strategic approach built upon common concerns that protects and enhances tribal sovereignty.
- C. Recognizing that an approach that is multi-pronged, with flexibility to allow tribes to take advantage of emerging opportunities as well as respond to immediate threats, is necessary to the success of the regional and national effort.
- D. The Salahadin tribes of Iraq have decided to participate actively in partnership with each other in working on a broad array of Salahadin legislative and policy issues in order to formally ratify and implement the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations.
- E. Northwest Tribes and USET Tribes entered into a formal governmental commitment through the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations on November 7th 2021 to create a unified voice for tribes from both coasts to assist Salahadin in addressing tribes' common concerns on human rights.
- F. Tribal leaders met with the Northwest Tribes at Sovereignty Summits of October 30th 2021 to provide the direction to develop a strategic approach based on the common concerns of member tribes ratifying the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations, including developing legislative and policy recommendations but primarily looking at administrative solutions which could be implemented by the Salahadin Executive Branch, and consensus was reached on the following:
 - G. A request for a moratorium on tribal governments autonomy in their efforts to implement the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations
 - H. A request to open talks to negotiate with states
 - I. Direction to the Salahadin Tribe to communicate these proposals in a letter establishing international indigenous treaty and
- J. On November 1st 2021, the Salahadin Tribe convened a Tribal Leader committee to draft this ratification of the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations which the concept of "government-to-government" relations between Tribes and the international community on the subject of autonomy was reiterated, and the development of a set of foundational tribal principles was called for international tribunal.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Salahadin tribe of Iraq does reaffirm its support, active participation and commitment to the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations to assure a strong unified voice for Salahadin tribe of Iraq not only on a regional, but a national level, and its commitment to the Covenant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Salahadin tribe of Iraq does agree to take a strong stand on the ratifying the International Covenant on the Rights of Indigenous Nations and urges that a moratorium be established on autonomy rights and requests actions to provide for formal intergovernmental autonomy tribunal discussions and negotiations between Salahadin and international communities Salahadin government representatives and the government representatives at the earliest possible date.

CERTIFICATION

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the Salahadin tribe of Iraq on November 20th, 2021 CE and shall be the policy of Salahadin until it is withdrawn or modified by subsequent resolution.
